2. Though salvation is a moment in time when a believer passes from spiritual death to life, the sanctifying work of becoming more like Christ is an ongoing process. The book of Romans paints a beautiful picture of what the sanctified life is supposed to look like (chapter 6) as well as what the reality often is (chapter 7).
 - a. Read all of Romans 6.
 - b. In light of this text, what changes did God impart upon every believer after receiving Christ?
 - c. What changes does God expect of every believer to move toward after receiving Christ?
 - d. Read Romans 7:15-25. What do we learn about the reality of the sanctification process for every believer from this text?
 - e. Keeping Romans 7:15-25 in mind, how can we encourage fellow believers who are struggling with sin and/or just away from the church?
3. In light of all this, is there anything you need to do differently?

1. Have everyone go around the group and share one thing someone else said that stood out to them.
2. Break up into smaller groups and pray for one another (preferably men with men and women with women).
