- c. Philippians 1:19-26. How does Paul balance his personal hopes and expectations with God's plan in these verses? In light of this, how should we keep our personal hopes and expectations in line with God's?
- d. Philippians 1:27-30. What does Paul pray for the Philippian church in these verses? Additionally, how does Paul encourage the Philippian church to act toward those who do not share our belief system or have our best interest at heart? In what ways do you feel this is relevant to something you are going through today?
- e. In verses 29-30, Paul says "it has been granted" to us to suffer for Christ's sake. Every part of our nature is to pray for blessing rather than hardship. How do these verses "sit" in your soul as you read them?
- 2. 2 Timothy 2:8-13 is another passage where Paul puts his own suffering in the broader picture of God's plan to advance the Gospel. Read it together and answer the following questions.
 - **a**. Have a few group members summarize the contents and key points using their own words.
 - b. What does this passage tell us about God/people/you?
 - c. Your message matters to God. Your story matters to God. Is there anyone you sense the Lord asking you to reach out to for the sake of the Gospel?

Digging deeper.

 - b. Philippians 1:15-18. In these verses, Paul suggests some have questionable motives when they preach the Gospel. Having read this, how ought we to think/feel when we might also be tempted to question the motives of someone in ministry?
